

## Tick Bite: What to Do

Ticks bites can make people sick. Below are some steps that you can take after a tick bite to reduce your chances of getting sick and how to get treatment promptly if you do get sick.

## Remove the tick as soon as possible

- 1. Use fine-tipped tweezers to grasp the tick as close to the skin as you can.
- 2. Pull upward with steady, even pressure. Don't twist or jerk the tick.
- 3. After removing the tick, clean the bite area and your hands with rubbing alcohol or soap and water.
- 4. Dispose of the tick by flushing it down the toilet. If you would like to bring the tick to your healthcare provider for identification, put it in rubbing alcohol or place it in a sealed bag/container.









## Consider calling your healthcare provider

In general, CDC does not recommend taking antibiotics after tick bites to prevent tickborne diseases. However, in certain circumstances, a single dose of doxycycline after a tick bite may lower your risk of Lyme disease. Consider talking to your healthcare provider if you live in an area where Lyme disease is common.

## Watch for symptoms for 30 days

Call your healthcare provider if you get any of the following:

Rash

Headache

Fever

- Muscle pain
- Fatigue
- Joint swelling and pain

Treatment for tickborne diseases should be based on symptoms, history of exposure to ticks, and in some cases, blood test results. Most tickborne diseases can be treated with a short course of antibiotics.



## Common questions after a tick bite

#### Should I get my tick tested for germs?

Some companies offer to test ticks for specific germs. CDC strongly discourages using results from these tests when deciding whether to use antibiotics after a tick bite.

- Results may not be reliable. Laboratories that test ticks are not required to meet the same quality standards as laboratories used by clinics or hospitals for patient care.
- <u>Positive</u> results can be misleading. Even if a tick contains a germ, it does not mean that you have been infected by that germ.
- <u>Negative</u> results can also be misleading. You might have been bitten unknowingly by a
  different infected tick.


# Can I get sick from a tick that is crawling on me but has not yet attached?

Ticks must bite you to spread their germs. Once they attach to you, they will feed on your blood and can spread germs. A tick that is crawling on you but not attached could not have spread germs. However, if you have found a tick crawling on you, it's a sign there may be others: do a careful tick check.

# How long does a tick need to be attached before it can spread infection?

Depending on the type of tick and germ, a tick needs to be attached to you for different amounts of time (minutes to days) to infect you with that germ.

Your risk for Lyme disease is very low if a tick has been attached for fewer than 24 hours. Check for ticks daily and remove them as soon as possible.

- 2. As shown each of the 4 mowing teams usually have a period of 4 weeks between their respective turns to mow, but this is subject to change (see below).
- 3. The schedule is NOT intended to be an unbending, all encompassing rule that covers every situation.
- 4. Each Team Captain is empowered to adjust his team's mowing time and day if required due to weather, special events or another reason; he is responsible for communicating his adjustments to all the members of his team.
- 5. In case of vacation or a leave of absence, it is the Team Captain's responsibility to swap weeks with another Team Captain.
- 6. Additional cuttings are at the discretion of the Team Captains.
- 7. The attached schedule will NOT be modified for any of the changes listed in items 4, 5 or 6.

#### **Our New Club Weather Station**

The URL for our new club flying field weather station is <a href="https://www.pwsweather.com/station/pws/midwestrc">https://www.pwsweather.com/station/pws/midwestrc</a>.

The QR code is posted at the flying field so that you can just scan it with your phone to get to the website.

One question I got from guys at the field is how to see the Wind Gusts.

Looking at it from an iPhone, Tap on the Today's Summary green button, then near the middle of the screen select Hourly (on the right side). This will show graphs of the readings for the day. Scroll down a bit an you will see a graph of wind with wind gust in light blue. Current wind speed in dark blue.

The weather station is sending in readings every 2 minutes but the PWS Weather website only updates every 5 minutes.

100% of the cost of the data cost for transmission, hardware and hours of software work was donated by me. It was something I wanted when living in Northville. It was hard to tell from being in subdivision how the wind was at the field. This is the wind and direction at the frequency board. Higher up could be a different story.

Another cool thing that Denny showed me was how to add it as an icon on your iPhone. On the iPhone web browser, while looking at the site, hit the box with up arrow on the bottom. Next scroll down to the Add to Home Screen pick. Select that. This will add an icon to your screen so you can just tap that and get right to the weather station PWS Weather website.
