May Show and Tell

Roger Wilfong shared a couple of his interesting conversions from foam, hand-launched gliders to electric RC.



The first one that he shared was an old Hitec. Note that he converted it to a pusher with twin booms to the tail.



He also shared a new, much larger version of his converted Hitec Glider.

It was loosely based gliders available from a German grocery store named Lidl, that sells inexpensive foam gliders.

His modifications included changing it to a twin boom pusher configuration, just as he'd done to the Hitec Glider. He did note that it was an easier conversion as hinge lines and servo pockets are molded in and that the canopy is removable. Roger pointed out the moulding lines.

His new version uses a 3S 1000mAh LiPo with a 1500Kv outrunner using an 8" prop. It draws about 15 amps and flies under power for about 17 minutes.

He said that he'll be experimenting with a 1300Kv motor and different props to extend the flight time.

Thanks for sharing these interesting conversions with us Roger!

2025 Mowing Information

Please Note:

1. The mowing schedule is presented as a general mowing guide to help insure that the field is mowed at least once a week.

2. As shown each of the 4 mowing teams usually have a period of 4 weeks between their respective turns to mow, but this is subject to change (see below).

3. The schedule is NOT intended to be an unbending, all encompassing rule that covers every situation.
4. Each Team Captain is empowered to adjust his team's mowing time and day if required due to weather, special events or another reason; he is

responsible for communicating his adjustments to all the members of his team.

Ford Tractor Rules:


Check oil and water before mowing!

The NCM (Not Conventional Materials) Event Traditionally, model aircraft airframes have been mostly constructed from balsa wood, plywood, spruce, and fiberglass. For the purposes of this meet, NCM airframes are mostly constructed from not conventional materials i.e.; sheet foam, foam board, cardboard, block foam, foam insulation material, etc.

Foam Flurry for NCM aircraft: This is a true event. It is based upon the all up/last down event of early electric meets. Any NCM aircraft may be used (no ARF types). Power systems are limited to a maximum of 3S (no paralleling) LiPo batteries or 4S maximum, no paralleling, for A123 packs. All planes qualifying for this event will launch at the same time, and the last one to land will be declared the winner.

I am happy to report that I have received new altitude information from the AMA yesterday.

A hardcopy will be kept in the club records per AMA's request.

New altitude limit 700 ft AGL during normal daylight operation hours, it remains 400ft 1/2 hour after sunset.

AMA is excited to announce that we have been granted a National Authorization allowing our members at AMA club sites in Class G airspace to operate above 400 feet above ground level (AGL) for routine, day-to-day activities. Your flying site, Midwest RC Society - 7 Mile Rd, has been granted a 700 foot altitude limit.
