Notable First Flight

Rich Sievert recently had a successful first flight of his 72" wing span WACO YMF5. He built this plane around 1995 and powered it with a Moki 1.8 engine. It is a very well finished and detailed model.

He spent last winter developing an electric powered conversion. He would like to have a fully aerobatic airplane but with the size of the model obtaining the optimium motor/ propellor combination is difficult. When using over a 20" diameter prop, there is a very limited selection of propellors.

No problems were experienced on the first series of flights. It is a very stable and beautiful flyer. Rich is still exploring alternative propellor configurations
